COVID-19 is making some people sick.



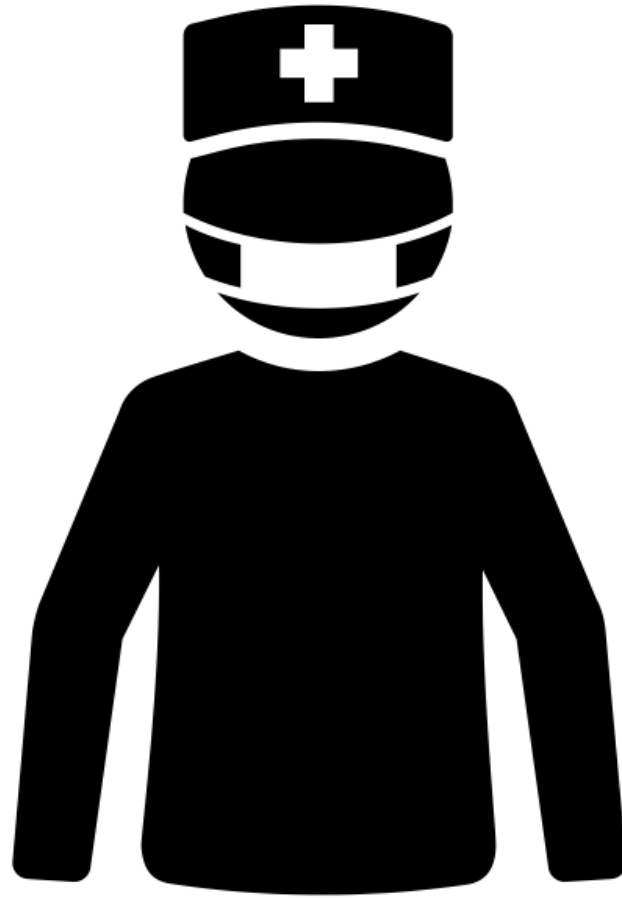
There is medicine that will help you stay healthy.

A doctor or nurse will give you the shot. They might give you another shot in a few weeks, too.

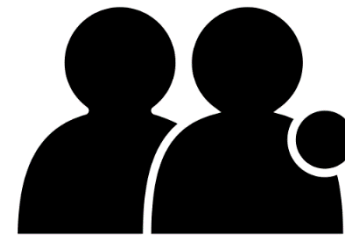
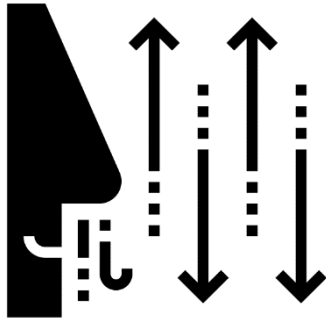
